



HOW TO USE THE PROCESS MAPS IN SAGE 200

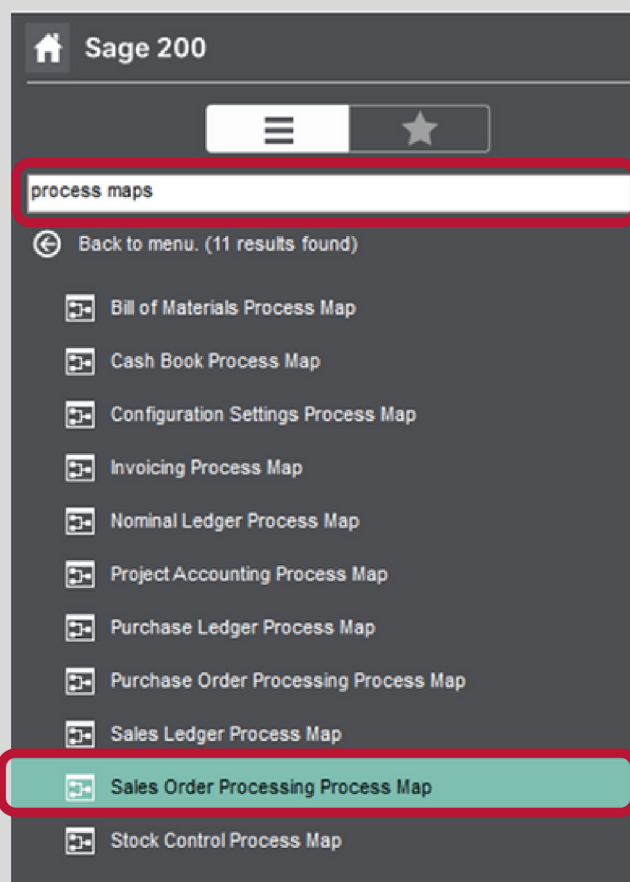

Using Process Maps are really useful, especially if you are new to Sage 200.

Stock, for example, is handled in a specific order as it travels from a quotation, through the order process to invoice and finally posting.

The order is very specific. Stock needs to be allocated before it can be picked and must be dispatched before the invoice can be printed, and only printed invoices can be posted.

The interactive Process Map will show you the order for each process.

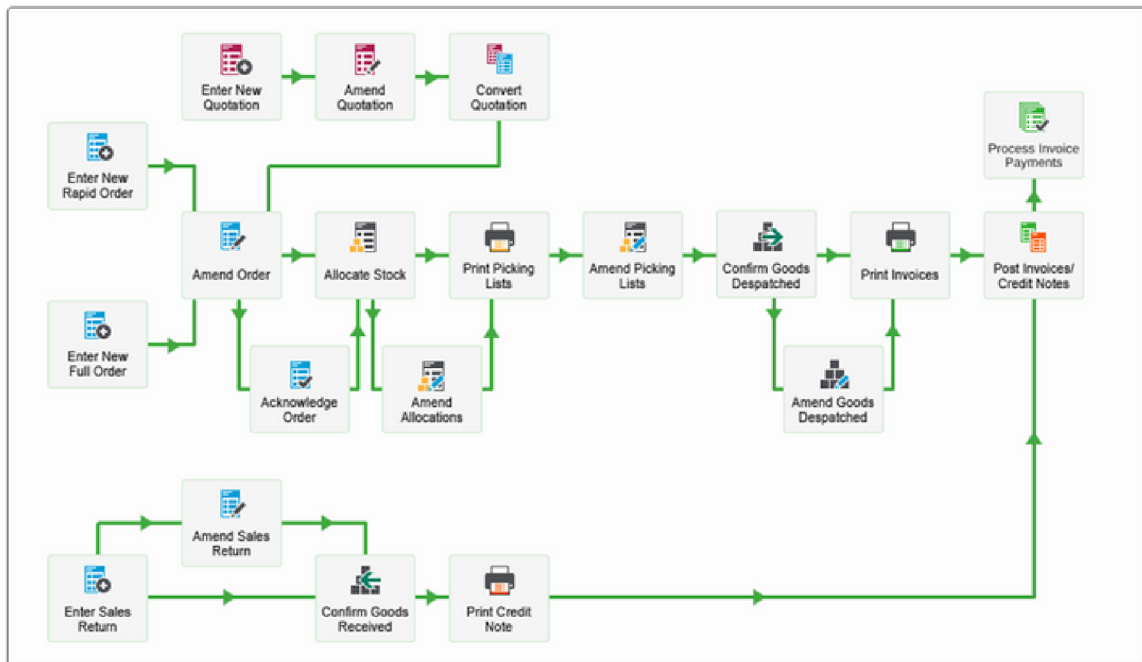


Use the search menu to find all the Process Maps in your system

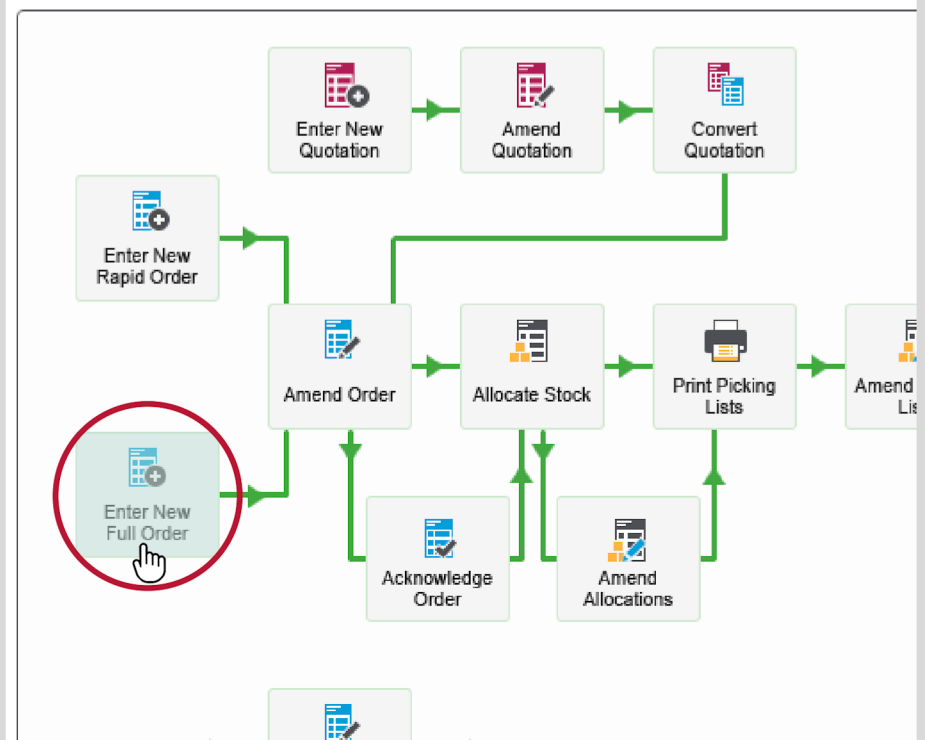
In this example we have used the Sales Order Processing Process Map

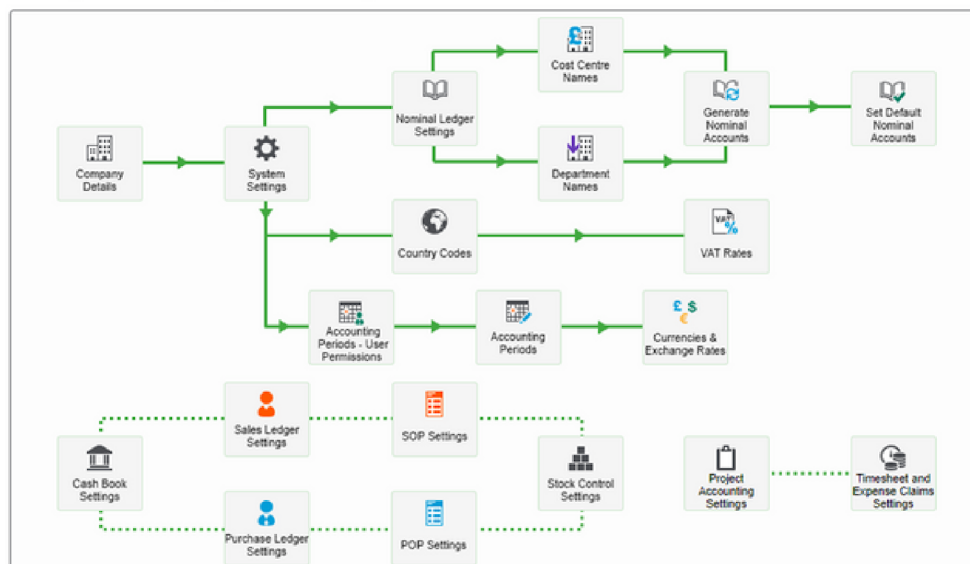
